DuPont (1880-1969), an avid collector of decorative and fine arts made or used in America as well as American architecture from 1640-1860. Lunch at Hagley Museum Café.

Transportation around the grounds at Hagley and through the Gardens at Winterthur is by small bus and tram. (Note: We have just learned that the DuPont home at Hagley will be closed for renovation during our visit, but the Museum has added more emphasis on the powder yard and machine shop to the tour. This will give us greater insight into the early history of the company, and we will tour the First Office, barn and garden.)

**IMPORTANT: The campground has only fourteen 50 amp sites. We do not anticipate extreme temperatures, either hot or cold, so it is unlikely that we will need to use air conditioners or extra electric heat. However, should anyone with a 30 amp site need additional power, we have been assured that we may use our generators at any time. There is a \$5 difference in cost per night between the 30 amp and 50 amp sites. The first registrants will be offered a choice of either 30 or 50 amp. The sites themselves are equivalent in size and ease of access.
