

TechTips!...........Dave S. Miller, President-Coachworks, LLC

What a great time we had in Atlanta with all the members that were able to ROCK out at Stone Mountain Park with us. Since the Atlanta rally, we are more excited than ever to be working on a long and mutually beneficial relationship with you all. For members we have not met yet, we hope to meet you at upcoming rallies in the future.

The big buzz now is fuel prices from "can you believe the price?" to how are we going to afford to travel?" We too are affected by this new reality we find ourselves in. I would like you to know we are concerned about that rising cost of fuel and what we as coach owners can do about it! Unlike many in the coach business, we have some advantages many don't. Our customer base consists of seated tour operators to entertainment operators to folks like ourselves.

We're trying to tap into the tour operators knowledge who spend a great amount of time and effort in the cost of coach

operation. The tricks we can learn from these operators should be helpful to all of us on what changes can be made to improve fuel economy. As we get proven tips from this group of customers, we will be passing this information on to you. Until then, one tip I can give you is slow down a little. Watch you Turbo gauge and keep your pounds of boost to 10 or less and you will see dramatic improvements in your fuel usage.

Many of you wanted more information on the pending national standard for broadcasting to digital or (DTV) and what affect it may have on you. I thought the explanation from Royale Phoenix filled you in on most of the information needed. The one area that seems to have importance to many of you was HD satellite transmissions. Now that we have so many options to us for HD and the fact that many of you are upgrading your Coach TVs to HD, we need to help you with some decisions that need to be made. Although KVH and TrackStar have HD tracking satellite dishes available and worked well several years ago, they now have become obsolete. Only two years ago, no more than five channels were available in HD over satellite. All of these first channels were easily found on one satellite. As Dish and Direct TV expanded their available channels, they simply ran out of space (no pun intended) on their satellites to broadcast all the channels on one satellite. This is where the problems started; as HD channels grew, so did the need for HD channels to be broadcast on several different satellites. For us

tracking satellite people, this creates a big problem "WE CAN ONLY LOCK ON TO ONE SATELLITE AT A TIME" Now we have a prob-



lem as my favorite HD channel is not on satellite 110; it is being broadcast on satellite 121. The problem for us is we would have the need to ask our dish to go find satellite 121, but the dish had a hard time finding it in motion. Today Direct TV has over (95) total HD channels available with that number going to (120) in the near future. Dish has fewer available HD channels at this time. Now comes the challenge. Direct TV has added two more satellites, now five total, and most of the HD programming is being broadcast on the two new satellites. Trackstar and KVH have not written new software to find the two new satellites; they still have the problem on seeing only one satellite at any one time. WHAT A MESS with no end in site for tracking satellite users.

So, for now, the only solution available for us coach people is to install a stationary multi LMB auto dish systems we can use while staying in one place. This new dish allows you to receive every available HD channel with only the push of a button. Based on our research, out of the several multi LMB stationary

satellite dishes available, WINEGARD makes the best. And if you're lucky you can install the new stationary dish at the front of the coach and leave the rear in motion dish where it is. This will give you greater ability in heavily treed RV parks of finding a clear satellite signal. You also have the luxury of keeping your in motion satellite function although HD limited for travel. The two available for full HD capability are from MOTOSAT and WINEGARD. We have found the WINEGARD to have a much heavier motor and gearing for the new larger dish. At present, we are installing four to six new system per month. Please feel free to call us for information.

For now I hope this helps! We look forward to spending time with all who will be at the Balloon race. And as promised, as we can get fuel saving tips from our customers, we will pass then on. Have a great summer and we wish you safe travels.

SOME NEW HELPFUL HINTS!.....Editor's Note: from a recently received email.

Vodka? Who knew?!!!!

- 1. To remove a bandage painlessly: Saturate the bandage with vodka. The stuff dissolves adhesive.

ATV vs. DTV vs. HDTV

As everyone knows, in February of 2009, Analog broadcasting (ATV) will cease to exist. Everyone has questions about what needs to be done to continue to enjoy television. Hopefully this article will lay some concerns to rest.

Analog Television (ATV):

Analog has been the standard since the birth of the Television. All TVs since then have been built with a NTSC(National Television System Committee) tuner which receives the Analog signal and translates it to a visual picture on the TV Screen.

Digital Television (DTV):

In February of 2009, the national standard will switch from ATV to DTV, Digital television. The new DTV tuner box, or "converter" box is an ATSC(Advanced Television System Committee) tuner; this is required to receive the digital signal. New TVs today are built with an ATSC tuner; any TV or device with an ATSC tuner can receive the DTV signal.

High Definition Television (HDTV):

HDTV has already been in use for a while now and is fast becoming the standard for Cable and satellite systems. HDTV, simply put, is a better quality signal than DTV. All HDTV signals are DTV, however DTV is not HDTV. As of today, HDTV is not yet broadcast from local Television stations, only DTV is being broad cast locally.

(Q)What do I need to do?

(A) The new DTV standard will only affect Local broadcast television. For those using Satellite or Cable, nothing further needs to be changed. If you want to watch local - over the air television broadcast, than a small inexpensive Digital tuner box will need to be added between your roof antenna and the TV. The tuner box receives the DTV signal and translates it back to analog so you can continue to use your older TV. The DTV tuner cost about \$99.00 per TV. Note that one DTV tuner can be used for all TVs; however all TVs will receive the same channel. It is recommended that each TV has its own DTV tuner. A second option would be to add a DVR, Digital Video Recorder. A DVR operates the same a VCR but it doesn't use a Video Cassette tape to record to, instead you record to a DVD disc, or in some models an internal hard drive. Most DVRs today have a built in ATSC tuner which will receive the new DTV standard. This would require a RCA Video connection on the back of your TV. DVRs are bit more expensive, ranging anywhere from \$200.00 to \$500.00. If you decide to go with the DVR option, be sure the DVR has a built in ATSC tuner; it should be clearly listed in the specifications.

(Q) What about the antenna?

Older analog TV antennas will receive the DTV signal just fine, however changing it to a digital antenna may yield better reception.

- (Q) Will I be able to continue to use my Universal remote or Crestron to control the DTV tuner?
- (A) The DTV tuner box uses an Ir remote and can be "learned" into any universal remote that has Ir learning capability, or programmed into a Crestron control system.
- (Q) My TV Says "HDTV Ready" does this mean I can receive the DTV signal?
- (A) Not necessarily, HDTV Ready simply means that High Definition can be viewed on the screen; it does not mean that the TV can receive DTV signals. Refer to the owner's manual of the television; it should state if the TV has a built in ATSC tuner. If the TV does have a ATSC tuner, then that TV will receive the DTV signal without adding a DTV tuner box. Another way to check if your TV has a built in ATSC tuner is to look at the remote number pad. If there is a button labled "DOT" or a button next to the "0" key with a dot as an image, then try to enter a digital channel such as "22.2". If you are able to enter Digital channels, then chances are the TV has a built in ATSC tuner. In this case, the coaxial needs to be moved from the NTSC tuner to the ATSC tuner.
- (Q) I just want to replace my old TVs with the new Flat screen TVs, what should I look for?
- (A) If you are buying a new TV within the next year or two, watch out for misleading advertisements and shady sales pitches. There are still a lot of unsold TVs out there that do not have built in ATSC tuners and the stores would love to get rid of them. Ask the sales person to show you in the TV specifications that it does in fact have an ATSC tuner. Terms like "DTV Ready", "HDTV Ready", or "DTV Capable" are all misleading terms and the TV may still require an add on Digital tuner. If the tuner is not specified as an ATSC tuner, don't buy it.
- (Q) I watch Satellite exclusively and I want to receive all the Satellite HDTV channels, what now?
- (A) In most cases the Satellite dish itself and the satellite receivers will need to be replaced with HD models. Both KVH and Tracstar offer an HD dish.
- (Q) Where can I find more information about my specific situation?

donned, bets were placed, and mint juleps were sipped. Only the sad ending of the Derby marred




the day when the filly, Eight Bells, went down.
